Dear Mayor and Councillors:

Re: EcoDensity Action C-9: Removal of Barriers to Green Building Approaches

Neighbourhoods for a Sustainable Vancouver is a city wide ad hoc organization of neighbourhood groups that includes residents' associations, CityPlan Vision implementation committees, ratepayers' associations and community groups. We noted at the Pan Vision meeting on September 10, 2008, the Director of Planning advised that the City was proceeding with what is now called "EcoDensity Action C-9: Removal of Barriers to Green Building Approaches. Please accept this as our comments on this proposed action.

In our letter dated May 28, 2008 on EcoDensity, we made the following comments:

"ACTION C-10 (now C-9): Removal of Barriers to Green Building Approaches Previous Action 3 – Incentives for green design

• Green buildings should be required, not bonused. Action C-10 still gives bonuses which we do not agree with."

These comments still apply. Throughout the EcoDensity consultations, the public made it clear that there was no support for bonusing for green design. So called "removal of barriers" by giving FSR exemptions is just the same as giving bonusing. The City cannot just reword an action and say it is responding to public input. This action clearly gives additional square footage, increased heights, and reduced side yards, which all are a form of bonusing for green design and will result in bigger buildings. Green design should be required for all new construction outright. We especially oppose this green bonusing for new single family and duplex construction. Relaxations to make these housing types even bigger will put even more pressure on demolition of existing buildings, resulting in loss of affordability and character. Exemptions and incentives should be reserved for retrofitting of existing buildings to make them more energy efficient, not for new construction which should have green building features as an outright requirement under the Building Codes.

Further, we would like to point out that EcoDensity policy is not required in order to approve green building standards. These should be incorporated into the Building Codes, some of which has already been done last spring by the Province. Considering EcoDensity was passed by Council with only 23% of letters for support and 77% of non-support or requesting changes, it does not represent a mandate for this action. It should be considered on its own merits that requires an inclusive and transparent consultation process that includes the general public.

Please consider our comments and include us in the stakeholder consultation processes.
